Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

Many thanks for all your support and your positive messages throughout our first term. It has been a daunting responsibility to reopen our school and try to protect our community in line with Covid protocols whilst prioritising education. Despite the many challenges, our community has risen to the task and, on reflection, it is really amazing how far we have come.

Students sit in classes for 58 minutes wearing masks, limited in their movements and still they remain positive and engaged. Teachers carry mini suitcases full of books as they transfer from one room to another along the one way system. The easiest things that we took for granted became logistical challenges.

This is down to your continued generosity. Please continue to assist us if possible.

We are currently developing our Active Flag walkway around the school to encourage the students to take exercise during the breaks in the school day.
