Many thanks for all your support and your positive messages throughout our first term. It was a busy return to school and our initial priority was to offer our students an opportunity to revise curriculum areas from last year to assist academic catch up. Each subject department engaged positively with this whole school initiative and assessments which followed showed that it was a very valuable way to start the new academic year.

The launch of our CLASS programme was a complicated undertaking that is now firmly embedded in the life of the school. Despite the restrictions associated with the CLASS programme including a national shortage of teachers, we nevertheless set about a recruiting and interviewing process building a team of teachers that would be able to deliver the school's programme. It is a much needed addition to the facilities in the school and will benefit every students' wellbeing.

Inter House competitions are as competitive as ever and we have just finished judging the Inter house Christmas tree decorating competition. The creativity in OLS continues to amaze us all from the innovative Geography models that students designed and created for Geography week to the book themed baking competition during Reading week.

As always, charitable acts reflect our values in OLS and the community has again rallied together to give generously to St Vincent de Paul, Pieta House, Peter McVerry and Goal.
