

IMPORTANT SCHOOL POLICY REMINDERS

- The School Code of Positive Behaviour must be signed by students and parents in the school journal. We are grateful for your support in these matters.
- Mobile phones. Mobile phones may be kept in the student's locker or turned off in her bag and should not be carried by the student on her person.
