Dr Niamh O'Brien has recently been awarded the Dr Fiona Bradley national award for her extraordinary work in Mervue Health Centre, Galway, and at the HSE West Addiction Services. The award citation described Dr O'Brien as "an outstanding exemplar of a general practitioner combining excellent clinical care with a fierce advocacy for all patients." Dr O'Brien is an inspirational advocate for all patients including those most socially disadvantaged. She has worked in the Galway Drug Treatment Centre and has a special interest in youth mental health.

As a proud Our Lady's girl, it is a great honour to receive this acknowledgment from the school. The late Dr Fiona Bradley was a champion of social justice and medical equality. In my work in Galway city as a GP and Addiction specialist doctor, I am proud to provide care to the most under-served members of society.
